DIRECTOR OF REGULATION

Dating back to 1895, the Society of Chartered Surveyors is a professional body in Ireland representing over 1,900 qualified chartered surveyors and a further 700 trainees throughout both the construction and property industries. The Society regulates the profession in the public interest and oversees all aspects of the profession, from education through to qualification and the continuing maintenance of the highest professional standards.

The Society is in the process of merging with the Irish Auctioneers & Valuers Institute and now wishes to recruit a **Director of Regulation** to lead the development and implementation of a regulatory strategy to fulfill its role in the regulation of the profession and to oversee the establishment of the SCS Registration Body for the registration of the use of the titles of 'Quantity Surveyor' and 'Building Surveyor' as provided under the Building Control Act 2007.

Applicants must be able to demonstrate the following:

- Knowledge and experience of working in a professional regulatory environment
- Experience in the preparation of strategies and policy development
- Familiarity with the EU Professional Qualifications Directive and Services Directive
- The capacity to analyse legislation and interpret its application
- The ability to lead in a regulatory environment undergoing change
- Strong and effective communication skills
- Highly developed teamwork skills
- Excellent organisational and presentation skills

A relevant third level degree in business and/or law is desirable and at least 5 years relevant senior work experience, preferably in a member organisation and/or professional body.
